### Expectations

- Hebrew School runs on Wednesday evenings, early session from 4:30pm to 6:30pm, late session from 6pm to 8pm. Ozrim are expected to arrive on time and immediately dive into classroom tasks with their teacher or *K'hilah u'T'filah* with the community.
- A highlight of our Hebrew School experience is the weekly 6pm *K'hilah u'T'filah* (Community and Prayer) time that brings together both sessions of Hebrew School and teachers, clergy, staff, and many parents and guardians. Ozrim continue to lead in this community and prayer environment by engaging in the goings-on of the room, helping students engage, and occasionally facilitating activities.
